When products containing asbestos are disturbed (for example, cut, broken, or drilled into), tiny asbestos fibres are released into the air. When these fibres are breathed in, they can become trapped in the lungs and can cause several very serious diseases.

We will work with you to understand your potential exposure history and investigate on your behalf. Even if you're unsure if or how you were exposed to asbestos, we can help you work it out. Common ways asbestos exposure can occur include:

- You handled products that contained asbestos at work
- You performed renovations to property that contained asbestos

If you were exposed to asbestos at work, even if your employer went out of business years ago, you may still be eligible for compensation. Regardless of your age or occupation, asbestos exposure can occur in many different situations and may have a major impact on your health. Some of the common asbestos related diseases include:

- + Mesothelioma
- Asbestosis

- + Lung cancer
- + Pleural disease



Learn more about Silica

Crystalline silica is a mineral in the Earth's crust and a basic component of soil, sand and granite. It's also used in the construction of materials such as bricks, tiles, concrete and artificial stone. When working with these materials you may be exposed to silica dust, particularly if using power tools to cut, grind and drill products. Some of the activities that might expose you to silica dust are:

- Brick cutting
- Angle grinding concrete
- Masonry
- Tunnel work
- Sandblasting
- Glass manufacturing
- Steel industry work
- Quarrying

- Concrete cutting, jack hammering and chiselling of concrete
- + Cleaning up/sweeping up of dust and debris
- Use of power tools to cut, grind and drill into artificial stone (eq. Caesarstone)
- Silica exposure can cause a range of serious health issues
- + Ceramics work



Silica dust is so fine it can enter the deepest parts of the lungs. It is marked by inflammation and scarring in the upper part of the lungs. The dust can build up in the lungs over time and cause scarring leading to a number of diseases. Silicosis is a very serious disease caused by the inhalation of crystalline silica. Excessive exposure to airborne silica dust can cause the following conditions:

- + Silicosis
- + Chronic bronchitis
- + Chronic airway obstruction

- Lung cancer
- + Autoimmune diseases
- + Chronic renal disease
